<u>Maintenance dredging to be carried out by Mormugao</u>

Port Authority

The Mormugao Port Authority has moved to dredge the current approach channel to the port as well along the various berths to improve the navigational depth for vessels. Dredging will also be done at the breakwater berths and at the mooring structures (dolphin) .

<u>First international cruise vessel - from Chennai to Sri</u> Lanka

India launched the MV Empress, its first international cruise ship, after realizing the potential of the industry. The cruise is built at a cost of ₹17.21 crore. This also implies that Indians won't need to travel outside the country to board a ship in order to take a cruise abroad. d. The tour package reportedly costs INR 86,383.

Maritime development in the Bay of Bengal

<u>Baltic Exchange's primary sea freight</u> index margins 1% higher

In a sign of revival in global shipping activity, the Baltic Exchange's main sea freight index has recorded its biggest weekly percentage rise in four months, since March 10. The .BADI, tracking rates for ships carrying dry bulk commodities, rose on Friday and marked its best week supported by a rebound in the capesize and panamax vessel segments.

<u>Green Shipping Corridor Plan between</u> <u>Australia -Singapore</u>

Australia and Singapore plan to develop a green and digital shipping corridor to be functional by the end of 2025. This builds on the earlier Green Shipping Cooperation agreement that the two nations signed in October 2022. Singapore's Maritime and Port Authority (MPA) and Australia's Department of Infrastructure, Transport, Regional Development, Communications and Arts (DITRDCA) are collaborating on the project.

Bangladesh to ratify Hong Kong Convention

The Hong Kong Convention for the Safe and Environmentally Sound Recycling of Ships 2009 (HKC) is at a turning point thanks to Bangladesh, a leading ship recycling country, which recently pledged to ratify the HKC within the next few weeks.

<u>Seafarer labor market has become particularly tight</u>

According to global shipping consultancy, Drewry' most recent Manning Annual Review and Forecast report, the shortage of officers on ships has reached a record level and is not likely to decrease. "Similar deficit levels are forecasted for 2023-2028", by the Annual Review and forecast report. The 2023 officer availability gap has grown to a deficit equal to nearly 9%.

Inmarsat Maritime Fleet Reach coastal LTE service

Immarsat Maritime, has unveiled its new Fleet Reach coastal LTE service for marine connectivity. This service offers commercial, offshore, energy, and fishing customers continuous high-speed broadband even while they are sailing close to the coast or are docked in port.

<u>Sri Lanka and India to expand maritime service between the nations</u>

Sri Lanka and India are stepping up their attempts to increase maritime and air services between the two countries to deepen their bilateral ties. In this context. Mr. Gopal Baglay, the Indian High Commissioner to Sri Lanka, met with Mr. Nimal Siripala de Silva, Sri Lanka's Minister of Ports, Shipping, and Aviation.

G7 price cap threatens to squeeze tonnage supply.

Crude oil prices, which spiked beyond the \$85 per barrel threshold following OPEC+'s voluntary production cut, have fallen below \$75 per barrel due to growing worries about the state of the world economy. However, the market may experience limited supply in 2023 if OPEC+ maintains the current voluntary production cuts.
